# REPORT ON TCA'S SPRING 2007 SHOW AND WORKSHOP

TCA held its annual Spring Show, Workshop and Auction April 13-15 at the Clarion Inn in Irving, Texas. Despite tornadoes and baseball-sized hail in some areas of the Metroplex, a good turnout was had.

Show entries numbered nearly 100, considerably fewer than in years past, but no complaints were heard from those folks who assisted in setting up and tearing down the show and rental tanks.

Speakers Ad Konings, Greg Steeves and Dean Hougen passed along valuable information with regard to various types of cichlid species. It is always a pleasure to have such knowledgeable individuals available to our members.

Saturday night's banquet was sold out. After Ad Konings gave a show talk on Malawi cichlids, several special awards were given out by master of ceremonies Ralph DeBoard to various TCA members. Kathy England was this year's winner of the John Gilliam Memorial Award for her service to TCA. David Andrews and Curtis Johnson won awards through their participation in TCA's Breeder Award Program. David Andrews had spawned the greatest number of different species, so he received the Most Prolific Breeder Award.

Then the show winners were announced.

All entries were spectacular this year, but the judges felt that the most spectacular was Coleen Ullman's red devil. Congratulations to Coleen on her second TCA Best in Show.

The auctions on Sunday, both live and silent, were absolutely wild! All live plants are now sold through the silent auction, and over 100 were sold there on Sunday – pond plants, bog plants, aquarium plants, and regular old garden and flowerbed plants. Not to mention gift baskets, blankets, jewelry, pillows, and other assorted donations. We had so many silent auction donations that some were kept back to use during the fall auction.

The live auction contained the usual fish, rocks and wood, and lasted 12 hours. All those who stayed until the "bitter end" are to be commended on their dedication (or their insanity). The most important things were that everyone had a great time and got home safely Sunday night.

#### Houston Livebearers Association

The Houston Livebearers Association invites all Texas aquarium societies to attend its gigantic auction Saturday, May 26<sup>th</sup> at the Galveston County Fair & Rodeo Fair Grounds, at Jack Brooks Park on Highway 6 in Hitchcock, You may enter the Fairgrounds Parking area from FM 2004 and drive through the Park or enter from Hwy 6. Check in 9am/start 11am/ closed 8 pm.

The HLA will charge 25% commission (10% for the clubs and 15% fee for the HLA to cover administration, check collections, and rent), collect/pay 8.25% taxes on all sales and let the sellers decide which participating club gets the club commission for each item when they sign in. The HLA will charge \$5 for bidder cards. Sales commissions will be waived for auction workers. All items will be sold "as is".

Presidents of participating clubs will be required to appoint or approve exactly two auction workers from their membership in order for their club to participate in the event. The president of the HLA will appoint and approve the remainder of the auction workers.

Sellers will be charged \$2/bag for rebagging leaking bags. The club doing the rebagging keeps the proceeds. Sellers and clubs will be paid two to four weeks in arrears to allow time to cash checks. The Galveston County 4-H Club will have the food and beverage concession. No food or beverages from outside will be allowed. This is a smoke free building and no alcoholic beverages will be permitted.
